So far this year our financial results are not quite up to our standards, but with some minor adjustments in March we should be back on track to our plan. For those of you who attended last

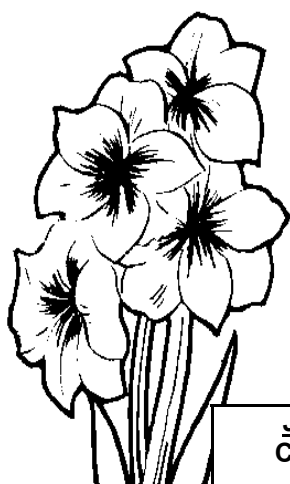

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Committee

The CERT continues to prepare and hone our readiness skills for the upcoming summer storm season.

At our March meeting, we were fortunate to have Ms. Jennie Briguglio, Director of Operations for the SPCA Suncoast and a former Pinellas County Sheriff's Deputy, train the CERT in Canine Behavior Training for First Responders. This course was designed for law enforcement officers in handling pets who might be upset and agitated while protecting owners and home environment in a disaster situation. Pasco County Sheriff's Deputies have received this training along with other law enforcement organizations in the Tampa Bay area. The Timber Greens CERT is the first non-law enforcement organization receiving this training by Ms. Briguglio. Normally this is a fee based course; however, due to the efforts of our Pet Preparations Chief, Jane Marinello, Ms. Briguglio agreed to waive the fee. We sent out a

flyer asking for the Timber Greens Community to donate cat and dog food, as well as other items needed by the SPCA. The response by the Timber Greens Community was overwhelming. Thank you all for your support to the SPCA and your CERT.

At our April meeting we will have Ms. Annette Doying who is the Director of Pasco County Emergency Management as our guest. Ms. Doying is newly appointed to this position and was confirmed by the Pasco County Commission in January of this year.

We now have 38 members of the Timber Greens CERT who are committed to the CERT program. Thirty-four of these members have gone through the Federal Emergency Management (FEMA) training provided by Pasco County Emergency Management. Notes from Community Patrol

Here are a few reminders from your Community Patrol: The speed limit in our community is 20 mph. Vehicles must yield right of way to golf carts and golf carts must yield to pedestrians. Please remember that there are STOP signs at the main entrance by the gate house. Please stop upon entering. A new traffic loop has been installed at the exit gate of Royale Oaks. we hope this will alleviate the problems some of our residents had exiting. Due to the smaller, composite-made, fuel efficient vehicles we now have, some of the loops are not recognizing the presence of vehicles passing over them. When you approach the gate, please slow down and pull up to the gate. If the gate does not open, please safely back up about twenty feet and approach the gate again, This should solve the problem. In the case where the gate does not open, please call Community Patrol at 372-6539; we are here 24 hours a day seven days a week.

As time passes on, we lose friends and contacts. Many of our residents have emergency contacts that are no longer available to respond to emergencies. Now is the time to update your contact information with Sandy. Should the need arise, Community Patrol may have to contact someone on your behalf and unless we have current information this may be impossible. PLEASE UPDATE!

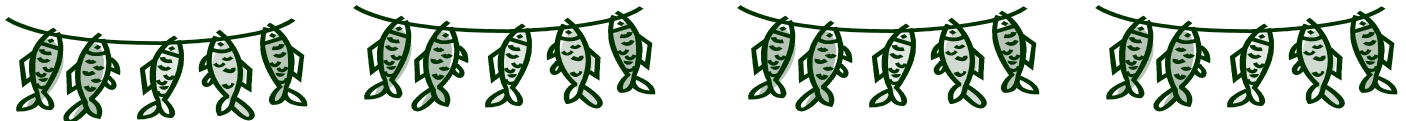

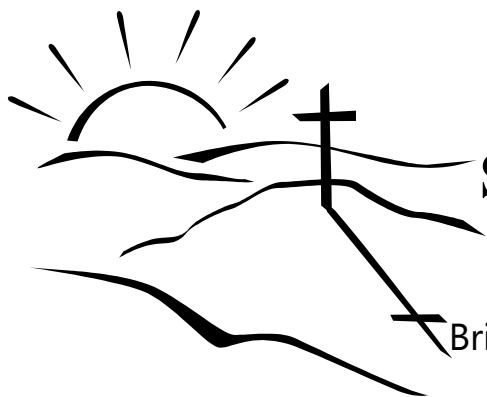

HANDICAP LESSON & PROBLEM OF THE MONTH: By Bud Wilkinson

Handicap Volunteer Committee: Bob Hartman, John Partington, Jim Freye, Dick Langton, and Larry Hanney. **(More volunteers wanted...Call Bud at 372-1127)**

Handicap Rule: Under the USGA Handicap System when you complete 13 or more holes you must record, for handicap purposes, scores for the un-played holes.

Problem: (NOTE: Player's Course Handicaps are shown in parentheses). ALEX(8), BILL(18), CECIL(22) and DAN (33) are playing in a game with a SHOT GUN START. They start their play on hole number 18 using the White tees. Due to a rain storm with thunder and lightning, they must quit after playing hole number 14. They were not able to play holes 15, 16 and 17.

Question: For Handicap purposes what *acceptable hole scores* should these players record for the un-played holes?

Answer: Since they completed 15 holes...and anytime 13 or more acceptable holes are played, a score must be recorded for Handicap purposes. The USGA Handicap System rule states you will record for the un-played holes **PAR PLUS ANY HANDICAP STORKE(S)** you are entitled to receive on the un-played holes. These players should record *Acceptable Gross Scores* for holes 15, 16 and 17, all Par 4's, as shown below. **(NOTE:** As shown on our Timber Greens score-card the handicap strokes for hole 15 is 10; hole 16 is 2 and hole 17 is 12).

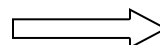
ALEX with an 8 handicap would not receive a handicap stroke for hole 15, would receive one(1) handicap stroke for hole 16 and no handicap stroke for hole 17. He would record a four(4) for hole 15, a five(5) for hole 16 and a four(4) for hole 17.

BILL with an 18 handicap would receive one(1) handicap stroke for each hole 15, 16 and 17 and would record five(5) each hole.

CECIL with a 22 handicap would receive one(1) handicap stroke for hole 15, two(2) handicap strokes for hole 16 and one(1) handicap stroke for hole 17. He would record a five(5) for hole 15, a six(6) for hole 16 and a five(5) for hole 17.

DAN with a 33 handicap would receive two(2) handicap strokes for each hole 15, 16, 17 and would record a six (6) for each of these holes.

Let me start this month's Green Scene article by mentioning a few items that are critical to the health of the turf on "your" golf course.

The stakes and ropes located throughout the course are placed and moved as needed to control traffic patterns. All I ask is that if you have to move them to hit your shot, please replace them. Without some form of traffic control the turf in those areas would become very beaten down and unplayable.

Please repair visible ball marks on the putting surfaces (greens). Ball marks left unrepaired eventually turn into ugly dead spots that take quite awhile to recover. In addition, if unrepaired, the next morning the greens mower has a tendency to scalp those areas, since they are higher.

Divots in fairways will eventually recover as the Bermuda grass grows right over the area due to its prostrate growth habit. The area will be much more level if you just top-dress the depression with sand. DO NOT replace the divot because the likelihood of survival is minimal. For those of you who moved here from cool season climates, you are probably use to replacing your divot. That's one big difference in turf types and growth habits.

Please keep all four (4) wheels of your golf car on the cart path near the green and tee slopes. For some reason many individuals like to get the two (2) wheels closest to the greens and tees off the edge which creates ruts and weak turf. It's difficult to hit a ball from these worn areas.

We want to do everything we can to keep your golf course looking nice, so anything you can do to help us out would be greatly appreciated.

I want to mention one more item that has nothing to do with the health of the turf, but your employees would appreciate it as it may affect the health of their nostrils. Let me start by saying that this is by no means a critical comment or issue. I think that it's great that everyone in Timber Greens cleans up after their dogs, but you would be doing us a big favor if you did not deposit those bags in the trash receptacles on the golf course. I thank you in advance!

Finally, what happened to winter? We had three (3) frosts this winter versus the fifteen (15) we had last winter and how about all the mild temperatures (record highs). WOW!!

As usual there's a lot going on in the maintenance department. Here are a few of the items on my list:

Bunker work continues	Tree trimming
Weed control	Insect control
Mowing (more than usual this early in the year)	New fountain installation in pond #6 (soon)
Course fertilization	Cleaning up maintenance area
